Additional Information	<p>The Specialist Chambers and Specialist Prosecutor's Office have jurisdiction over crimes against humanity, war crimes and other crimes under Kosovo law in relation to allegations reported in the <u>Council of Europe Parliamentary Assembly Report of 7 January 2011</u>. KSC is a temporary judicial institution with jurisdiction over natural persons of Kosovo/Federal Republic of Yugoslavia, or persons accused of committing crimes against persons of Kosovo FRY/citizenship.</p> <p>The President of the Specialist Chambers, President Ekaterina Trendafilova, is responsible for the judicial administration of the Specialist Chambers and other functions conferred upon her by the law. One of the central duties of the President's judicial administrative tasks is to assign judges from the Roster of International Judges to Panels and cases that come before the Specialist Chambers. The President represents the Judges' Chambers. President Trendafilova has a distinguished legal career and extensive</p>

	<p>experience in criminal law and procedure, international criminal justice, humanitarian law and human rights.</p> <p>Cases at the Kosovo Specialist Chambers have not started yet. The Specialist Prosecutor's Office is now assessing and evaluating approximately 700,000 pages of documentation, comprising around 70,000 documents, along with some 6000 related items – videos, photographs, transcripts and other items collected during the investigation to date.</p>

Additional Information	In the case of the <i>Prosecutor v. Dominic Ongwen</i> , the Prosecutor alleges that during the period from 1 July 2002 until 2004, the Lord's Resistance Army, an armed group, allegedly carried out an insurgency against the Government of Uganda and the Ugandan Army (also known as the Uganda People's Defence Force - UPDF - and local defence units - LDUs). The warrant of arrest for Mr Ongwen was issued following the Pre-Trial Chamber's determination that there were reasonable grounds to believe that the LRA had been directing attacks against civilian populations, and that, in pursuing its goals, the LRA had engaged in a cycle of violence and established a pattern of "brutalization of civilians". This had been carried out by acts including murder, abduction, sexual enslavement, mutilation, and mass burnings of houses and looting of camp settlements. Civilians, including children, are believed to have been abducted and forcibly "recruited" as fighters, porters and sex slaves to serve the

	<p>LRA and to contribute to attacks against the Ugandan army and civilian communities. Mr Ongwen is alleged to be the former brigade commander of the Sinia Brigade of the LRA.</p> <p>The Prosecution has concluded its presentation of evidence and the case is in recess until the start of the Defence presentation of evidence.</p>

Franko Simatović was employed in the Second administration of the DB of the MUP.</p> <p>Both accused were acquitted of all charges by an ICTY Trial chamber on 30 May 2013. On 15 December 2015, the ICTY Appeals Chamber ordered that Stanišić and Simatović be retried on all counts of the indictment. The</p>

Additional Information	The primary mandate of the Special Tribunal for Lebanon is to hold trials for the people accused of carrying out the attack of 14 February 2005 which killed 22 people, including the former prime minister of Lebanon, Rafik Hariri, and injured many others. The Special Tribunal for Lebanon is currently in the trial phase for the case of the <i>Prosecutor v. Ayyash, et.al.</i> This case relates to the assassination of former Lebanese Prime Minister Rafik Hariri and the killing of others on 14 February 2005. The indictment was confirmed on 28 June 2011. It was subsequently amended due to case developments, including joinder with the case against Mr Hassan Habib Merhi and the death of former Accused Mr Mustafa Amine Badreddine. The trial opened on 16 January 2014. The Accused currently facing trial <i>in absentia</i> are Messrs Salim Jamil Ayyash, Hassan Habib Merhi, Hussein Hassan Oneissi and Assad Hassan Sabra. Warrants for their arrests remain outstanding.

Additional Information	<p>The International Court of Justice (ICJ) is the principal judicial organ of the United Nations (UN). It was established in June 1945 by the Charter of the United Nations and began work in April 1946.</p> <p>The seat of the Court is at the Peace Palace in The Hague. Of the six principal organs of the United Nations, it is the only one not located in New York. The Court's role is to settle, in accordance with international law, legal disputes submitted to it by States and to give advisory opinions on legal questions referred to it by authorized United Nations organs and specialized agencies. The Court is composed of 15 judges, who are elected for terms of office of nine years by the United Nations General Assembly and the Security Council. It is assisted by a Registry, its administrative organ. Its official languages are English and French.</p> <p>The Permanent Court of Arbitration was the first permanent intergovernmental organization to provide a forum for the resolution of international disputes through arbitration and other peaceful means. The PCA was established by the Convention for the Pacific Settlement of International Disputes, concluded at The Hague in 1899 during the first Hague Peace Conference. The Conference had been convened at the initiative of Czar Nicolas II of Russia "with the object of seeking the most objective means of ensuring to all peoples the benefits of</p>

	a real and lasting peace, and above all, of limiting the progressive development of existing armaments.”
