## Core Courses -“Doing Business in Japan”

The core 4-unit class is taught by Professor Keisuke Abe (Part 1, Japan Legal System), Professor Yasuhei Taniguchi (Part 2, Japan Legal System), Professor Mitsuo Matsushita (Japan and International Trade Law) and Professor Philip Jimenez (International Business Transactions).

It is taught at the Asia Center in our 2<sup>nd</sup> floor classroom, room 2C. The address and contact info of the Asia Center are on the front of this PROGRAM SCHEDULE. Students are required to ***attend ALL tours***; the Japan Supreme Court, the Ministry of Justice, the Japanese Diet (usually including a meeting with a high ranking Diet member) and the Japanese Patent and Trademark Office.

The program's optional course is *Japan Patents and Trademarks* taught by Yoshiyuki Inaba, a practicing Japanese patent attorney at one of the largest law firms in Tokyo.
