Writing a Stellar Essay



Steps to Success + Exercises for Global Program Applicants





Writing Essays can be stressful—but it doesn't have to be. Make the most of your time with these tips and knock your next application out of the park!



READ THROUGH THE ESSAY GUIDELINES

Write down each question or topic that the essay prompt is asking you to address in a bulleted list. Leave space under each bullet.



BRAINSTORM HOW YOU WANT TO ANSWER EACH PROMPT

Now that you have a sheet with each of your topics in a bulleted list, start writing down ideas on how you might address each topic.



CREATE A STRUCTURE

Now, you have draft idea for the main body of your essay. Arrange each of these topics in a way that flows nicely. You still need an introduction and a conclusion.



WRITE YOUR FIRST DRAFT

We recommend that you start with a spark to engage the reader. Start with "why" you want to study abroad and where you want to go. Be sure to include your entire program title, term and program type. Next, summarize what you will share in your essay.

It's important that your reader has caught a glimpse of who YOU are and WHY this experience will be meaningful for you, personally and professionally.



PROOFREAD & POLISH

Proofread your essay. Then share it with a strong writer in your community to get their thoughts on it. Be sure to check that your essay answers each of the scholarship prompts.



GET FEEDBACK FROM THE HUB WRITING CENTER

Appointments can be 30, 45, or 60 minutes. Share details about the writing project or assignment (you can upload prompts and rubrics via their appointment portal. <u>www.scu.edu/provost/writingcenter</u>



SUBMIT YOUR ESSAYS!

Be sure to resolve any additional suggestions from the HUB Writing Center. Send it back to them if you want to, and if time allows for one more check. Then when you feel good about it, submit and give yourself a pat on the back. You did it!



CREATE YOUR FIRST DRAFT

To the right you will see the suggested structure for your essay. Body Paragraph 1, 2 and 3 should be comprised of all of your topics/questions from Step 2. Group topics that are similar to one another in the same paragraph around a theme. Themes could be related to how your experience will impact you. For example: personal, academic and professional impacts.



INTRO TIPS

Start with why. Include what you are doing and where. Share part of your story. Who are you? How do you identify?Introduce the impact this experience will have on your life, which will be further explained in body paragraphs 1, 2 +3. For example: "Studying abroad in South Africa will impact my personal development (body paragraph 1), academic achievement (body paragraph 2) and professional goals (body paragraph 3)."

INTRODUCTION

BODY PARAGRAPH TIPS

Arrange all of your topic/questions from step 1 + 2 into groups related to your three themes. Your paragraph themes should be arranged in the same order that you introduce them in your introduction.

CONCLUSION TIPS

Reiterate everything you already mentioned in a summary. Consider including how your study abroad experience could be shared with your communities and how it will impact your future.
