# Core Courses -"Doing Business in Japan"

The core 4-unit class is taught by Professor Keisuke Abe (Part 1, Japan Legal System), Professor Yasuhei Taniguchi and Professor Kyoko Ishida (Part 2, Japan Legal System), Professor Mitsuo Matsushita (Japan and International Trade Law) and Professor Philip Jimenez (International Business Transactions).
