Dear Geneva students!

I hope this message finds you well.

In this message I would like to share important information on housing with you, so you can start booking your preferred housing at one of the very convenient housing options that our partner Webster University offers (for more information, please see housing brochure attached).

Once you have reviewed this email in its **entirety**, please contact our partner at Webster university, Ms. Gael Baboulaz (baboulaz@webster.ch) indicating

- your housing location (LLC or Les Berges)
- and room preference (single or double), and
- your dates and times of check in and check out.

IMPORTANT: Some of the housing options are limited, so Webster will take into account your preferences based on the order they receive them. Also, you should get in touch with Ms. Baboulaz not later than March 23th, if possible.

If you prefer to not stay at one of these options but want to find something on your own, you do not have to contact Ms. Baboulaz. However, please do remember that you still will be responsible to be on time for all the classes and the site visits.

If you do not yet know the exact time of your arrival and departure, **please let her know at least the dates**, as this is important to secure your preferred housing option. Also, in this case, let her know your exact times as soon as you have them, to make sure that someone is around to let you in when you arrive.

Rate: As a preliminary matter, please note that the cost of all housing options is CHF 65.- (about 64.- USD, which is a really good deal for Geneva!). The housing includes charges for electricity, water, heating, wifi, and one set of bed linens and towels.

Description of housing: You have two options available to you:

The **"Living and Learning Center (LLC)"** located on campus in Bellevue with mostly single occupancy studios and **"Les Berges du Rhône (Les Berges)"** centrally located in "downtown" Geneva with mostly double shared studios.

You can view the housing option comments on the Facebook group, or better yet, contact previous students via the Facebook page and ask them for their recommendations.

Here is a short description of each housing location and option:

1. Residence Les Berges du Rhône - OFF CAMPUS

Les Berges du Rhône is located in the heart of Geneva. The commute to campus from Les Berges is on tram and train. The tram stop is less than 100 meters away from the residence and takes you to the main train station in 10 minutes. From the train station, the regional train (usually runs every 30 minutes) takes you to the

Webster campus in 7 minutes. The train stop is right at the bottom of the campus. The whole commute takes approximately 25-30 minutes.

If you choose this housing, please make sure that you take into account the commute time, so that you are in class on time every morning. Tardiness due to the commute is never an excuse.

- Les Berges du Rhône offers double occupancy studios : studios for two students, furnished with two beds, two desks and two wardrobes, equipped with a kitchenette (stove, micro-wave oven, utensils) and a shared bathroom.

- A few single rooms might be available (single rooms in double units, shared bathroom and kitchenette)

2. Living and Learning Center (LLC) - ON CAMPUS

The Living and Learning Center is on the Webster campus, a "hop and step" away from our classes. Although it is a short commute to the center of Geneva, it is certainly convenient for the academic portion of the program.

- LLC offers single studios : single occupancy unit comprising one room furnished with a bed, bedside table, wardrobe, desk and bookshelf, and equipped with a kitchenette (stove, micro-wave oven, utensils) and a private bathroom (shower and toilet).

- A few single rooms might be available (single rooms in double units, shared bathroom and kitchenette)
