Students,

Attached is our **PRELIMINARY Calendar for the classes portion of the 2018 Shanghai Program**. Please note that the classes/professors/trips are subject to change, but for the most part this will be the structure of our time in Shanghai.

To get full credits for your time in Shanghai, attendance at all classes are mandatory (the scheulded has been created to fulfill specific ABA requirements regarding academic credit hours).

Please do NOT schedule anything on the dates listed as "TBD". There is a chance that we may schedule events or instruction during that time; or, we have left it open in case we need to move one of the classes or events to that date. Note also that the final exam as well - which is currently scheduled for June 7th - may be moved to June 8th (again, depending on whether classes need to be moved around).

You will note that some of the classes are scheduled to take place at law firms, and will be taught by attorneys. We will be traveling to the law firms for those classes. These are mandatory class meetings.

You will also note two educational trips in the calendar as well: one to Intel Corp. in Shanghai to meet with their General Counsel in Shanghai; the other to the Minhang District Courthouse. Like the law firm visits, these are also mandatory class meetings.

The "Orientation" is mandatory as well. Please be on the Jiao Tong Campus by that time on Sunday, May 20th. You will note the calendar lists two "Group Dinners" as well. Those are hosted dinners by me (and will not cost you anything). The Group Dinner after the orientation is mandatory as it is your first chance to get to know the others in the program. The second scheduled dinner (after our final) is highly encouraged as it will perhaps be your last time to meet and celebrate as an entire group. In addition, during the three weeks of the classroom portion of the program, we will likely have other informal lunches and happy hours that I will be hosting; those will all be optional.

Finally, you will note that the weekends have nothing scheduled. In the past, if students are interested, the Program has facilitated certain activities. But, in general, that is your own time to explore the city.
